

# Metadata Editing

## Editable Fields

This feature allows the user to edit the following details for a ripped CD:

- Album Name
- Artist Name
- Track Names
- Genre
- Album Cover

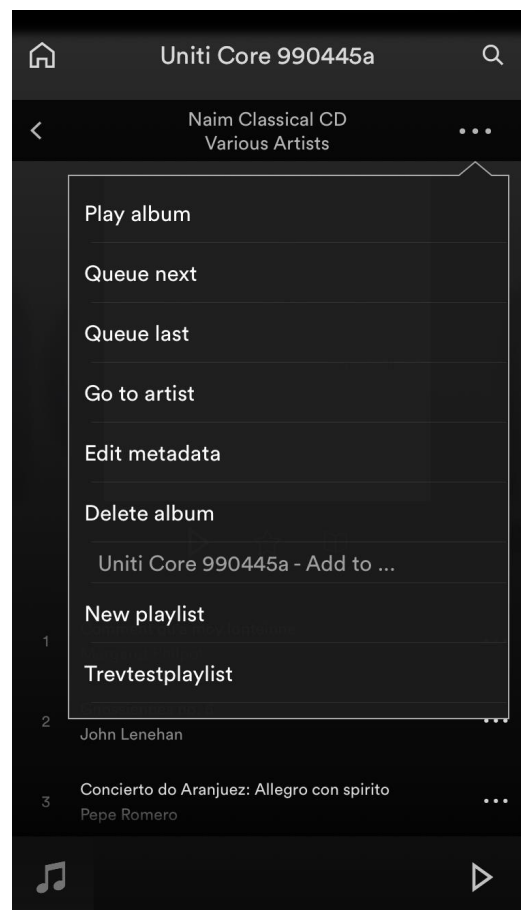
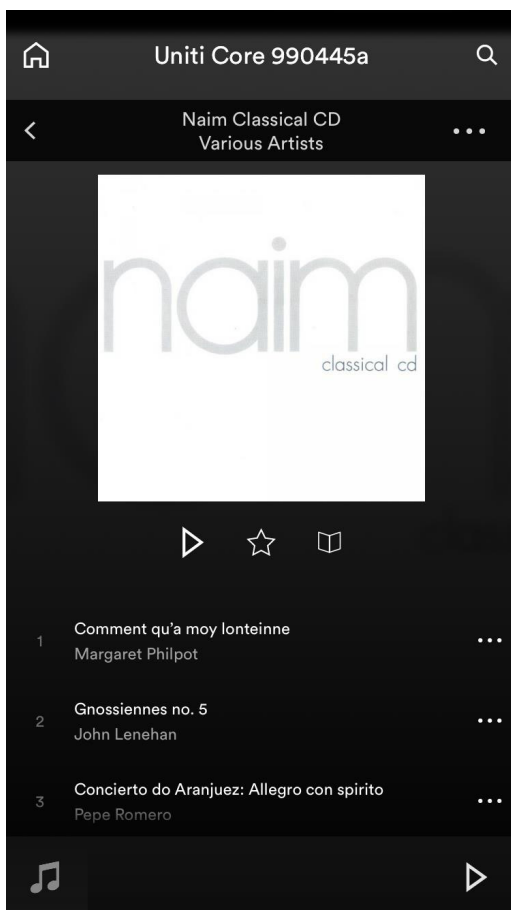
Please Note:

- Only ripped CDs, or CDs imported from a previous Naim server that have been ripped, can be edited.
- Music content in the Downloads Folder cannot be edited so the option will not be available.
- '*Artist Name*' cannot not be changed globally, only on a per CD basis.

After updating Uniti Core, it will restart and rebuild the database.

The time taken to rebuild your database will depend on the size of your music collection and can take up to an hour or more. During this time the edit metadata feature will not be available, and until it has finished all albums will not be shown in the '*Album*' view.

To edit the metadata for a particular album, choose the album and under ‘Global Options’ choose ‘Edit metadata’.



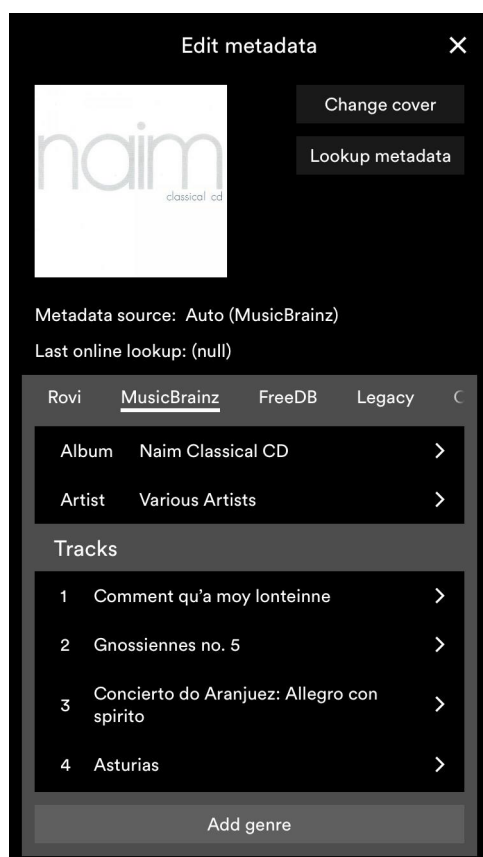
## Metadata Sources

By default the system chooses metadata for the album based on what is available and the following order of priority:

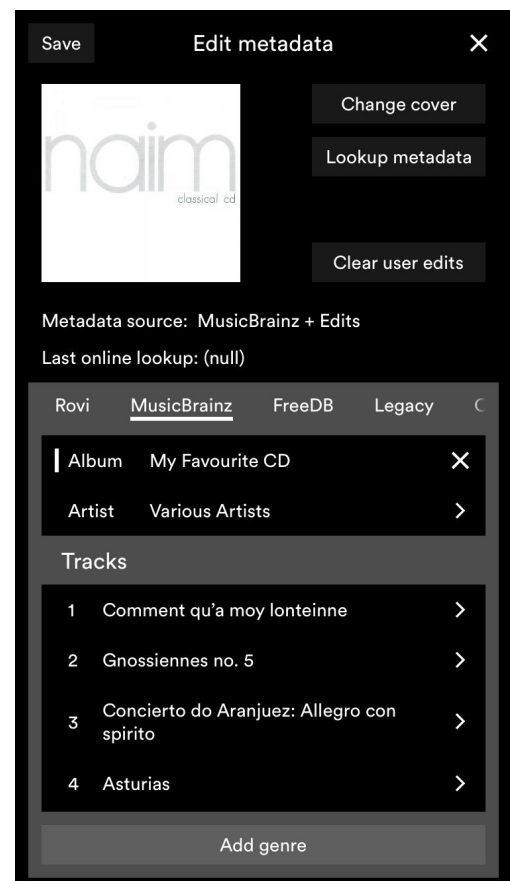
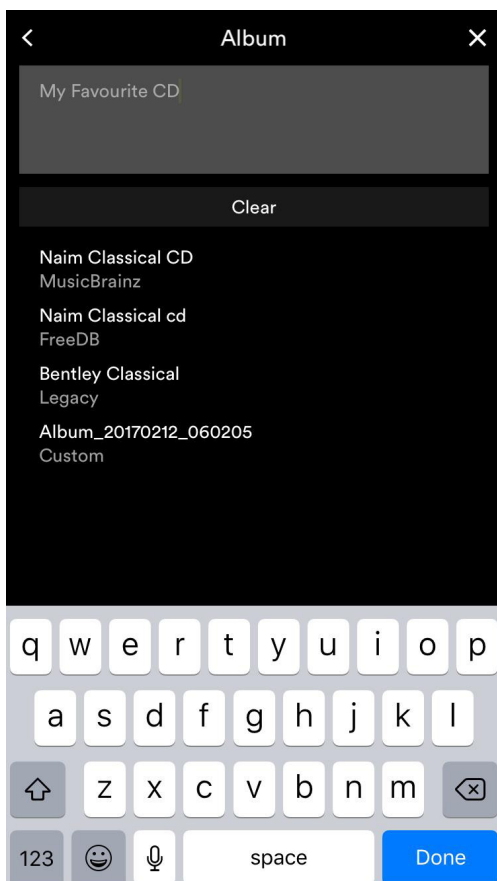
1. Rovi
2. MusicBrainz
3. FreeDB

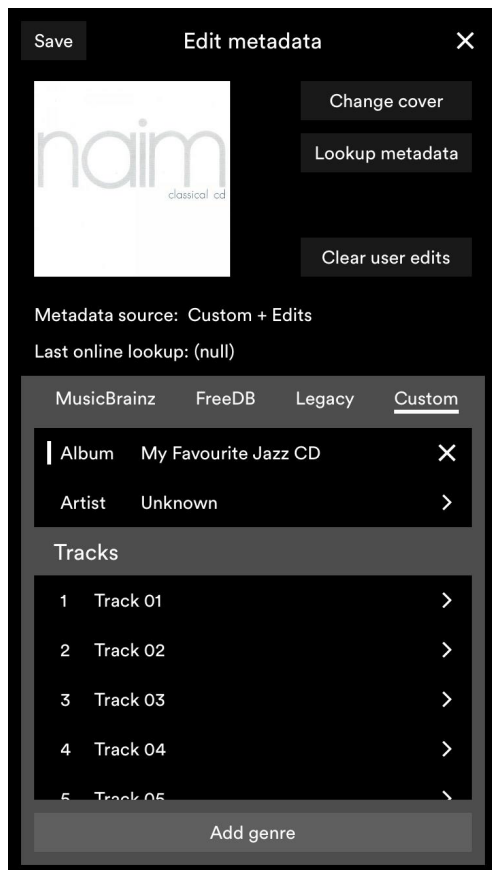
The user can override this on a per album basis by choosing which metadata source is used.

To edit a particular field, the user selects the field they want to edit on any of the metadata source tabs.



This edited field is then overlaid onto each metadata source so the user can choose the best source with minimum edits.

## Importing a Naim Music Collection

When the user imports a collection of music from a Naim server, a tab will be shown called '*Legacy*'.

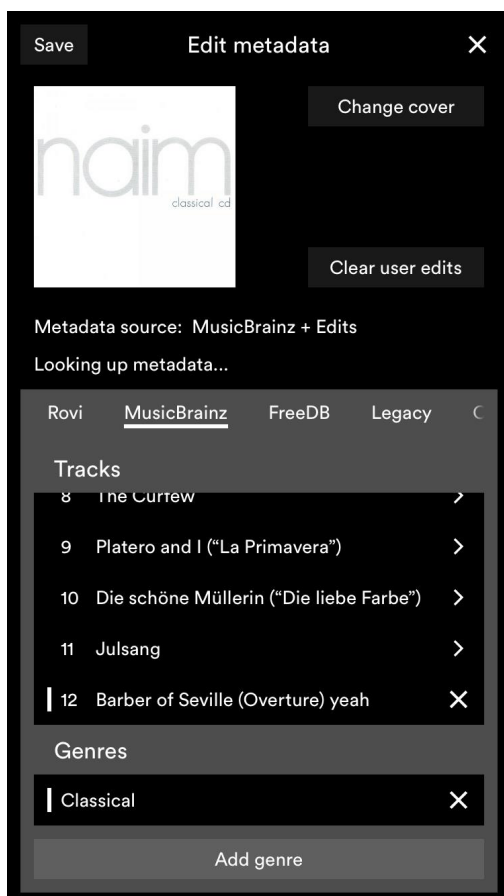
This will be chosen by default if the CD has had user edits applied previously. Otherwise, if data exists for Rovi, MusiBrainz or FreeDB, the highest priority one of these sources will be chosen.

When a Uniti Core is updated to the firmware which includes the '*Edit Metadata*' feature, if the database already includes music from a previously imported Naim collection, any user edits applied on that collection will be reinstated automatically.

## Genre Handling

Uniti Core uses Rovi genres. However, if a genre has been imported with legacy data then this can be chosen by choosing the ‘Legacy’ tab.

For any tab the user can add a new genre or delete the genre applied to that album. This feature is located by scrolling to the bottom of the screen.



## Forcing a Lookup

The user can choose to force a lookup of metadata by selecting the '*Lookup Metadata*' button. This will lookup metadata and report on the date of the last lookup. If no data exists online it reports (null).

## Changing Artwork

To change the cover select '*Change Cover*' and select one of the options for locating the artwork for the cover:

- Google image search
- Bing image search
- Discogs search
- Photo library

## Helpful Views for Metadata Editing

To help find albums that may need editing, new views are provided in the App under the '*More...*' button.
